1. Mole screening

Understanding naevus morphology and pigment distribution is essential in order to provide an effective mole screening service. This course will address the key principles on how to deliver an expert service.

2. Difficult benign melanocytic lesions

The diagnostic challenge of complex melanocytic tumours including combined naevi, congenital naevi, collision tumours, will be clarified.

3. Difficult melanoma

The key diagnostic dermoscopic features of amelanotic, hypomelanotic and hyperpigmented melanoma will be illustrated and explained in depth.

4. Dermoscopy in the general skin clinic
