Basic Dermoscopy

Course Components

1. Dermoscopy devices

With dozens of different devices on the market how do you choose a dermatoscope? The course will illustrate the key differences between all standard devices including the latest devices, ensuring the choice of device is best suited to your diagnostic needs.

2. Dermoscopic imaging

Digital photography is becoming a relatively straightforward process. However, the addition of a dermatoscope to the camera complicates the photographic process greatly. This course will illustrate common pitfalls in dermoscopic imaging and provides tips to maximise the diagnostic potential.

3. Diagnosing benign skin lesions

Dermoscopic features of benign melanocytic and non-melanocytic lesions will be illustrated in depth, highlighting the variety of ways benign skin tumours present.

4. Diagnosing skin cancer

The key diagnostic dermoscopic features of melanoma and non-melanoma skin cancer will be illustrated and explained in depth.

5. Special sites

Benign and malignant skin tumours on acral and facial skin can provide an additional diagnostic challenge. Dermoscopy can provide diagnostic detail to help reduce unnecessary surgery on these critical anatomical sites.

6. Safe Dermoscopy

Practical tips to introduce dermoscopy safely into clinical practice will be explained. Additionally the opportunity for case discussions and the infamous dermoscopic quiz will enhance the learning opportunity for all delegates.
